Ohio child care providers serving families that receive state assistance for child care must be quality rated in Ohio's Step Up To Quality (SUTQ) rating system by June 30, 2020. Families may lose child care and their ability to maintain employment and children will lose the opportunity to receive the education and care they deserve if this deadline is not met.
