The Ohio Child Licensing and Quality System

(OCLQS) website is used for licensing and amendments. Programs must keep their information updated in OCLQS. It is also used by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) and the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) for programs to submit an initial registration, renewal, or change of rating for Step Up To Quality (SUTQ).



The **Ohio Child Care Resource and Referral Association** (OCCRRA) helps child care programs and professionals as well as families locate helpful resources.

FCC providers can access:

- Administrator Core Knowledge & Competencies Self-Assessment
- Ohio Professional Registry information and documents
- Documents to support your program including infant, toddler, preschool and school-age specific information

The **Ohio Department of Job & Family Services (ODJFS)** is the largest agency in the state and is responsible for supervising the state’s public assistance, workforce development, unemployment compensation, child and adult protective services, adoption, child care and child support programs.

The **Ohio Professional Registry** is a centralized information system for early childhood and afterschool professionals. Individuals track professional growth and development and are recognized for their experience, education, credentials and training.

Once information is entered into the Ohio Professional Registry and documentation uploaded for verification to the Ohio Child Care Resource & Referral Association (OCCRRA), a career pathway level (CPL) is awarded.

PD Track is the online tool that allows professionals to search and register for statewide trainings delivered by multiple agencies. Trainings taken through PD Track are automatically linked to a profile on the Registry.

The **Organizational Dashboard** allows you to access employee/staff registry information through your own registry profile.
