Paper plate Cotton balls Glue  How to: 1.Cut and fold the paper plate in half. 2.Glue the streamers onto the folder half of the plate. 3.Glue the cotton balls to the rounded portion of the plate to mimic a cloud. 4.You can hang your new rainbow on a window to let the light shine through it to cast a real rainbow in your home.
